What is a mandated reporter?

In California, a mandated reporter is a professional who is required to report instances or suspected instances of child abuse. Mandated reporters include doctors, medical examiners, health care facility workers, daycare workers, school employees, and members of the clergy. Volunteers of public or private organizations whose duties require direct contact with, and supervision of children are not mandated reporters but are encouraged to obtain training in the identification and reporting of child abuse and neglect. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles encourages all in our church to speak up to the appropriate authorities if any form of child abuse is suspected. 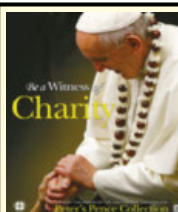

A prophet's garden

In his last few days on earth, he had only one request: *plant my tomatoes.*

For decades he had kept a large garden at his suburban home: green beans, Swiss chard, thyme and parsley, peppers, and cucumbers and, of course, his beloved tomatoes. Well into his 90s, he cultivated his garden every year. Summer visitors would leave with gifts from his garden — “not just a nourishing sign of his love but an effort to stave off any waste from the sometimes too-fertile plot.”

His granddaughter Carine Hajjar writes in **The Boston Globe** [May 8, 2024] that her late grandfather's life “was defined by sowing without the thought of reaping.”

“He was a model of moderation, from the words he used to the resources he consumed. He listened before giving an opinion. He mended his clothes instead of buying new ones. He ate all his leftovers before visiting a restaurant. And he saved when blessed with excess.

“Then he gave splendidly. He quietly donated much of his wealth to cancer research, to our church, to his favorite charities, to family members starting new lives. And to lovingly spoiling his late wife. He sowed so that others may reap.

“And throughout his 99 years, he had never been honored for the lives he changed, the careers he quietly made, or, most of all, the love he modeled. No plaques, no signs, no articles. And he wouldn't have dreamed of it.”

His modesty even extended to the annual Veterans' Day parade in his town, Hajjar writes. Her grandfather “declined to wear any hats or pins or his old uniform, which still fit the ever-slim nonagenarian. Nor would he stand when veterans were called to for recognition. He did this in honor of his friends from his hometown . . . who made the ultimate sacrifice in the Pacific while he used his engineering degree to honorably serve as a Naval engineer.

“But . . . if the rain is good and the rabbits are merciful, [my late grandfather] will get the only recognition he's ever wanted as his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren gather on the sunny deck overlooking his garden for a final taste of his tomatoes.”

Carine Hajjar's grandfather's generosity of heart and living responsibly for the common good are the marks of the prophet. A true prophet is model of humble integrity, an illuminator of the light of God's presence in every arena, the conscience of his or her people — no matter what is required of the prophet in giving his or her witness, even to the point of being rejected, misunderstood, or ridiculed. In Baptism, God calls all of us to be “prophets” in the spirit of his Christ: to proclaim God's word whether we are corporate powers or hardworking gardeners. The work of the prophet requires a faith that never falters in the conviction that the justice of God will triumph over injustice, that God's mercy will triumph over hatred, that God's light will triumph over the darkness of sin and death.
